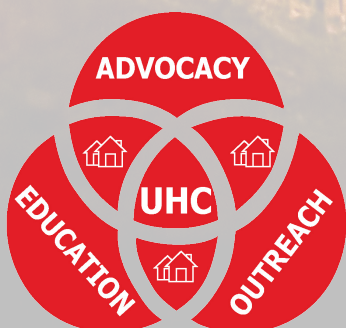

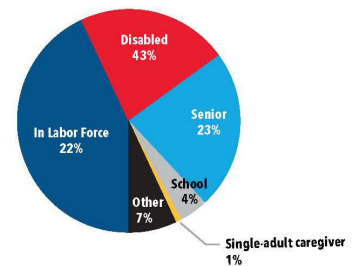

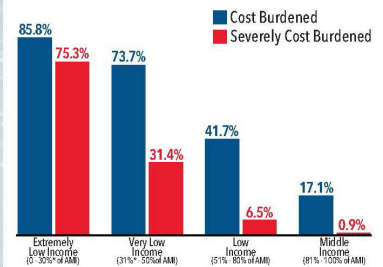

EXTREMELY LOW INCOME RENTER HOUSEHOLDS



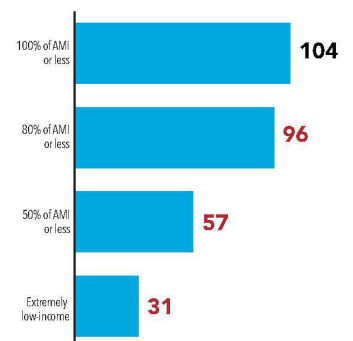
